ant for Christmas...is a Vaccine

Hardeman County first responders, home health care providers, student health care providers, and staff members and residents of group homes were the first to be given the COVID-19 virus that arrived last week.

During phase one of the Tennessee COVID-19 Vaccination plan, Tennessee County Health Departments will be providing the first doses.

Tennessee received an initial allocation of a total of 115,000 doses of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, following Emergency Use Authorization issued by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and recommendations released by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. The Moderna COVID-19 vaccine was shipped to all 95 Tennessee county health departments. Smaller hospitals that are not receiving the Pfizer-BioN-Tech COVID-19 vaccine are expected to receive Moderna vaccine the week of December 28.

The FDA announced Wednesday that vials of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine, which are labeled as containing five doses, may include

enough of the vaccine to provide six or possibly seven doses. FDA has announced these additional doses may be used, meaning Tennessee may have as many as 11,000 more doses of this vaccine to provide than originally expected.

"We are excited to receive these additional vaccines and see our COVID-19 vaccination activities underway," said Tennessee Health Commissioner Lisa Piercey, MD, MBA, FAAP. "Tennessee county health department staff members will administer the Moderna vaccine to first responders, home health care providers and student health care providers in partner-

Initial supplies of the COVID-19 vaccines are limited. The first allocations of both the Moderna and Pfizer COVID-19 vaccines in Tennessee will be used to provide first vaccine doses to individuals qualifying for Phase 1a1, as detailed in the COVID-19 Vaccination Plan for Tennessee. It is important to note these Pfizer and Moderna COV-ID-19 vaccines are not interchangeable; each patient must receive two doses of the same vaccine to be pro-



tected against COVID-19. Those who choose to receive the vaccine will receive a card with the date of their first dose, the name/manufacturer of the vaccine received and the date on which they should receive their second dose.

"Tennessee's plan for allocation of COVID-19 vaccine has been thoughtfully developed with a focus on how best to serve our diverse populations and communities, and to ensure distribution of vaccination sites across all 95 counties, especially in rural areas and those with high concentrations of people in vulnerable populations," Piercey

Tennessee's local health departments continue to offer COVID-19

testing five days a week at no charge to those wishing to be tested.

Bolivar General Hospital also distributed the vaccine beginning December 19.





Time for New Year's Financial Resolutions

Many of us probably felt that 2020 lasted a very long time. But now that 2021 is upon us, we can make a fresh start – and one way to do that is to make some New Year's resolutions. It fell over the next several months, but still remained about twice as high as the rate of the past few years. Of course, much of this surge in Americans' proclivity to save money was due to our lack of options for spending it, as the coronavirus caused either complete or partial shutdowns in physical retail establishments, as well as dining and entertainment venues. But if you did manage to boost your own personal savings when your spending was constrained, is it possible to remain a good saver when restrictions are lifted? Probably. 





are in the bowl. Break your candy coating into squares (it makes it melt better) and place in a pan on low

heat. Stir until it is all melted. Pour candy coating over the popcorn and mix until all the popcorn is coated. Add M&Ms (however many you want) and spread out onto a cookie sheet lined with parchment paper.

Top with crushed candy canes and drizzle candy melts on top. Refrigerate for a bit but take out ½ hour before you eat it so it's not so hard. ENJOY!

Christmas 2020 by Jeff Capshaw

According to the Revised Common Lectionary, the second reading for this Christmas Eve is from the Epistle of Titus. This is one of Paul's Pastoral Letters to his young protégé, Titus, who served the house Churches on the island of Crete.

Those churches came under the influence of false teachers who had caused problems for the baby Christians. Paul wrote to correct those errors, to rebuke the false teachers, and to provide guidance for putting things right in those congregations.

Within this epistle, Paul enumerates both the problems and the solutions for Titus to preach and teach to his congregants. This week's passage provides a snapshot of advice for living during tumultuous times, and it is applicable for the Church today.

Paul writes, "for the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his own possession who are zealous for good works" (2:11-14, ESV).

Three key themes are noteworthy. The first one is the grace of God. Paul says that God's grace has appeared in the form of Jesus, and it has appeared for all people. In other words, grace isn't just for the Jews, the religious people. Rather, it was for all, including the Pagan Gentiles. As Paul wrote elsewhere, the Gospel . . . "is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek" (Romans 1:16).

The same grace that provides salvation also provides the ability to live godly lives by refusing to go along with false teachings and the worldly, Cretian influences in Titus' context. God's grace empowers believers to live righteous lives, even during chaos and turmoil.

The second key theme in the passage is the coming of God. Yes. The coming of God! This is one of the most explicit statements on the divinity of Christ in the New

Testament. That is why it is the Church's "blessed hope." This will be the Second Advent of Immanuel ("God with us"). As Isaiah has said, "Say to those who have an anxious heart, 'Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you" (Isaiah 35:4).

The final theme in the passage is the people of God. The primary work of Christ in the Gospel is the final redemption of all creation. The focus of the passage here, however, is the redemption or the saving of a people belonging to God. In turn, as Andrew Murray said, God's people are to be "ardently, enthusiastically devoted to their performance."

Living in light of these truths will give you a truly Merry Christmas!

Isolated Loneliness by David Cov

Spending the last eight months viewing a loved one through a window of a senior living care center. What is your first thought as you first read this? Especially if this is your first time you have ever been aware of this type of extended separation, what do you imagine would go through your mind if you were to experience this type of separation from a vital family member and could only see them through a window or not at all? It is thought that chronic loneliness occurs when it coincides with long term isolation. It is characterized by an unrelenting and pervasive feeling of being alone and separated and divided from others, and an inability to connect with others on a deeper level (cigna.com). HRSA speculates that 43% of seniors feel lonely on a regular basis; 45% of seniors who report feeling lonely are increased risk of mortality; while Loneliness is more dangerous than obesity and as damaging to health as smoking 15 cigarettes a day (hrsa,gov). It is truly frightening, if you dwell on these ideas too long.

One suggestion which I think is a good one is to turn loneliness into solitude. Where loneliness is filled with dread and fear, solitude is filled with tranquility and peace. (journals.sagbub.com). I have dealt with the benefits of solitude in a previous article, and have just made a short video on creative socialization that will be posted on sfdcares.com website. Someone growing up as an introvert would be very comfortable being by themselves. Psychiatrists probably believe we once were comfortable being by ourselves, while others believe that we are in a loneliness crisis in the world. 

CoreCivic's Whiteville Correctional Facility in Whiteville, Tennessee, held a socially-distance graduation ceremony on December 17, for 21 student-inmates who earned either a high school equivalency (HSE) diploma or a vocational certificate.

Vocational programming prepares inmates for better jobs following release. Historically, student-inmates at CoreCivic facilities nationwide have earned vocational certificates in construction fields such as carpentry, masonry, electric, plumbing, and heating, ventilation, air conditioning (HVAC). Computer-based certificates are also available, and inmates have earned vocational certificates in Microsoft Office and computer coding. At many



CoreCivic facilities, inmates can participate in programs that issue industry-recognized certificates (IRC) in Braille, diesel maintenance, and welding. These 11 vocational program graduates at Whiteville earned certificates in carpentry, electrical, and HVAC.

The 10 student-inmates who earned their HSE diploma are also equipped for employment following release. One graduating inmate, Chad Young (pictured above), was motivated to earn his HSE diploma by an additional factor: his children.

"I want to be a good example for my two sons," said Young. "This [accomplishment] proves that you are never too old to complete a high school education."

The Editor's Inbox...Letters to the Editor

The Year 2020 has been a difficult one for many law enforcement agencies and in some cases rightfully so. However, I want to give a shout out to the City of Bolivar Police Department for their work under the leadership of Chief Mike Jones and especially one of their long-term Veterans, Captain David Sipes.

The Bolivar Police Department is very instrumental in helping two businesses in which I am involved, Bolivar Housing Authority and Dixie Funeral Home. They serve as Bolivar Housing Authority's security officials and Dixie Funeral Home's traffic through the city escort.

Though the Bolivar Police Department has several officers that perform their duty with a total community concern, Captain Sipes has shown special ability to defuse problems throughout his years of service.

What comes to mind is a story about a former Bolivar police officer, the late John Archie Williams. The story is one where he was dispatched to serve a warrant on a local young man. John Archie went to the young man's parent's home, where he was at the time. Upon arrival at the house on the porch was the young man's mother. John greets her and sits down in a chair on the porch and talks with her like he was visiting her for the day. A little while after the pleasant conversation he told her his reason he was there, to arrest her son. The mother called the son out of the house and told him to get in the car with John Archie and don't give him any problem. The young man got in the car without incident and John Archie took him to jail.

I don't know the crime the young man committed but assume it was not a violent crime. But regardless of the crime, the story shows how John Archie was able to communicate with people where they seem almost honored that he was there to take someone to jail.

The stories I have heard about Captain Sipes are similar. I have heard reports that when there were problems with patients or clients at any of Bolivar's mental health facilities, Captain Sipes was one of the main officers asked to come for assistance. He had the ability to communicate and listen to people that were going through a true mental meltdown and to somehow defuse the episode where that person could be taken into custody without incident.

Not everybody has the ability of those two civil servants but those that do should be recognized. Captain Sipes, Bolivar Housing Authority and the Dixie Funeral Home staffs recognize you and thank you for your contribution to this community.

Send Me a Postcard Sometime

Starting in January 2021, the Department of Revenue will send postcards to motor vehicle registrants to remind them of upcoming renewal dates.

The postcards will replace traditional letters and will reduce state mailing expenses by an estimated \$500,000.

"This is a more efficient, effective way to remind citizens about their upcoming registration renewals," Commissioner David Gerregano said. "It's also a good way for the state to save money without sacrificing any services."

The department partners with the state's 95 county clerks to administer vehicle title and registration in the state. You can find more information about renewals, as well as a sample postcard, on the department's website at www.tn.gov/revenue/renewals.

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the department encourages motorists to renew their registration online at www.tncountyclerk.com. If you do not have online access or your county does not have online renewals, you can mail in your renewal to your local clerk. The TN-CountyClerk website also allows registrants to sign up for e-mail and text message reminders about renewal dates.

The Department of Revenue is responsible for the administration of state tax laws and motor vehicle title and registration laws and the collection of taxes and fees associated with those laws. The department collects about 87 percent of total state revenue. During the 2020 fiscal year, it collected \$15.1 billion in state taxes and fees and more than \$3.2 billion in taxes and fees for local governments.





Young now looks ahead with hope to new opportunities available to him following


