#### Hearts for Eternity by Jimmy Sadler "Yet God has made everything

beautiful for its own time. He has planted eternity in the human heart, but even so, people cannot see the whole scope of God's work from beginning to end" (Ecclesiastes 3:11, NLT)

There is a wonderful song about a man living out his last few breaths. He has lived a life on the streets and is looking forward to death. "We were built for glory. We were made to last.

God formed our feet to walk golden streets when this hard life is passed. It's time to make your peace with God cause this life's over fast" (Built for Glory, Made to Last by Terry Taylor).

Some men claim to embrace the notion of our lives being temporary, that we live, die and exist no more. Although I respect the fact that these people are hoping to align their world views, I think there is something of eternity intrinsically planted within us. We react to the deaths of people with a sense of lives being cut short, of going "before their time." If we are temporary beings of chance, then there really is no concept of being granted any time, whether brief or extended.

It saddens me that many in the scientific community consider our mortality to be absolute, an end to a closed system. The studies of life after death take on a skeptical tone, attempting to discredit the notion instead of understanding it. I won't say all, because there are many in the medical community who see evidence of a transition from one life to the next. There are a good number in the field of astronomy who marvel at what they consider to be God's design. Still I wonder about this concept of eternity being planted in our hearts. If this is true, which I believe it is, then any defiance toward a concept of life after death is simply a sinful repression of what is within us.

It seems unlikely that people would joyfully embrace a theory that says we die and no longer exist. It has it's pluses, however. A life that has an absolute end

cannot also be judged. I can do anything I want and in the end it is unknown to me, erased from meaning and holds no power over my current life. It's a stretch, but there can be an odd comfort in believing that this is all there is. I won't be sad about it in the end, because I will not exist any longer. If I am temporary, there is no iudgment.

I wake up each morning thinking about life. It doesn't seem temporary. I do face the reality of aging, but not with much grace. I don't like it. It seems foreign to what my heart tells me. Perhaps if you feel the same, we can both celebrate the fact that this hunch is God planted. He has placed this inception-like hope for what lies beyond our grasp. #### 2. The Church is God's Devising, Not Man's.

In Ephesians 3:9-11, Paul reveals who is the architect and planner for the church when he said, "and to bring to light what is the administration of the mystery which for ages has been hidden in God who created all



things; so that the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the church to the rulers and the authorities in the heavenly places. This was in accordance with the eternal purpose which He carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord," The eternal purpose refers to the divine plan that came to fruition while Jesus was on the cross and realized on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:36-47). His death secured the necessary means of building the church (John 12:32; Isaiah 2:2-3).

Jesus declared the church to be of divine origin when He said, upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it. "I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on earth shall have been bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven." Notice Jesus says that the church belongs to Him, as He calls it, "My church." He would divinely direct His apostles and prophets in what was already "bound" and "loosed" in heaven. When men come behind the Lord and the church of His devising—to build their own version of the church called a denomination— they build another kind of church entirely! And NOT only is that completely unnecessary, it is also sinful! Christ has already provided for us "all things" in the scriptures what we need to be His church (2 Peter 1:3; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; Jude 3). All men can do to a perfect church (Ephesians 5:23-27) is make it imperfect and corrupt with their own devised creeds, their own traditions, their own selfimposed worship, and their own brand of organization (Galatians 1:6-9). And when they do such, they have more in common with Jeroboam in 1 Kings 12:26-33, as "....he went up to the altar which he had made in Bethel on the fifteenth day in the eighth month, even in the month which he had devised in his own heart; and he instituted a feast for the sons of Israel and went up to the altar to burn incense." When will men learn the lesson, that God did NOT call men to wake up one day with their own vision of what they think or feel the church should be? But rather, we should all humbly obey the gospel and be a part of the church that Jesus has already established on Pentecost (Acts 2:41-47).

As you may have heard, the stock market has been on a wild ride lately. What's behind this volatility? And, as an investor, how concerned should

Let's look at the first question first. What caused the steep drop in stock prices we experienced on a few separate days?

Essentially, two main factors seem to be responsible. First, some good economic news may actually have played a significant role. A 17-year low in unemployment and solid job growth have begun to push wages upward. These developments have led to fears of rising inflation, which, in turn, led to speculation that the Federal Reserve will tighten the money supply at a faster-than-expected rate. The second cause of the market volatility appears to be simply a reaction to the long bull market. While rising stock prices lead many people to continue buying more and more shares, some people actually need to sell their stocks – and this pent-up selling demand, combined with short-term profit-taking, helped contribute to the large sell-offs of recent days.

Now, as for the question of how concerned you should be about this volatility, consider these points:

Sell-offs are nothing unusual. We've often experienced big sell-offs, but they've generally been followed with strong recoveries. Of course, past performance is not a guarantee of future results, but history has shown that patient, persistent investors have often been rewarded.

Fundamentals are strong. While short-term market movements can be caused by a variety of factors, economic conditions and corporate earnings typically drive performance in the long term. 



## **Hardeman County Schools Step Up Security Measures**

Hardeman County Superintendent of Schools Warner Ross sent a letter to parents this week announcing the implementation of random canine searches in all schools, effective immediately.

"This program is designed as a deterrence," explained Ross. "All schools as well as teachers and staff are included. The visits will focus on common areas, lockers, hallways, parking lots versus individuals."

Ross commented in the memo that, "A safe school environment is critical. With the recent events concerning school safety and an increased presence of many forms of illicit drugs in our nation, state, and communities, we are taking every reasonable precaution to ensure a safe and healthy learning environment is available for our students and staff."

According to the memo, the canines are trained to detect the presence of illicit drugs, prescription pills, alcohol, and firearms. All campus buildings, parking lots and grounds will be randomly inspected for prohib-

Random searches will be done in cooperation with our School Resource Officers (SRO's) and local law enforcement officials and will be in compliance with specific regulations included in Tennessee Code Annotated 49-6-4201 and 49-6-4204 that regulate inspections and searches within schools.

"Our primary intent is to deter behaviors, however, if found, we will work through local law enforcement partners to enforce laws and initiate the appropriate disciplinary actions to include upholding zero tolerance consequences. We look forward to working with our new partners and the community to help keep our schools safe," the memo concluded.
